

#### About the composer

Kim André Arnesen (b. 1980) grew up in Trondheim, Norway. At the age of six he began playing the piano, and when ten started singing in the Nidaros Cathedral Boys' Choir. Educated at the Music Conservatory in Trondheim, he had his first performance of one of his compositions in 1999. Now an elected member of the Norwegian Society of Composers, he has written music that has been performed by choirs all around the world. In 2010 his first large-scale commissioned work, a *Magnificat*, was performed in Nidaros Cathedral in Trondheim, and subsequently released by 2L on CD and Blu-ray. In 2013 the St. Olaf Choir and Nidaros Cathedral Girls' Choir performances of his pieces *Even when He is silent* and *Cradle Hymn* were released on the CD, DVD and Blu-ray titled *Christmas in Norway*; the Nidaros Cathedral concert where these had been performed was aired on TV in both the U.S. and Norway. In 2014 his *Requiem* was premiered by the Nidaros Cathedral Boy's Choir. Arnesen is currently busy producing his first solo piano CD and is working on several newly-commissioned choral works. ## About the poet

Euan Tait was born in 1968 in Berlin, and now lives in Wales. After many years working in the L'Arche community, he ran employment training programs with adults in the 2000s, and now lectures in English and Creative Writing. Throughout the UK he runs music retreats, exploring the inner life of great choral works. His poetry has been published in the USA, Ireland and the UK. As a librettist, his choral symphony text *Unfinished Remembering*, commemorating the outbreak of the First World War, was performed in Birmingham's great concert venue Symphony Hall in September 2014.
